Position Summary

The Specialist Music Teacher – Violin (SMT-V) casual position requires a professionally qualified and musically knowledgeable violin teacher with the ability to effectively teach and support students (beginner to highly advanced) from K-12 with a wide range of musical interests and abilities. This casual role will require the successful applicant to plan, prepare and implement appropriate teaching repertoire and resources, provide high quality, supportive feedback for student improvement, demonstrate and apply validated pedagogy and technique. Essential to the role is the interpersonal and intrapersonal skills necessary to effectively collaborate and communicate with other specialist teachers, the curriculum, classroom teachers and parents as part of a high-performance, highly efficient music team culture.

Key Responsibilities

- Teach an allocated load of individual violin and viola lessons.
- Be proactive in providing an academically challenging, stimulating, enjoyable and safe environment where students are enthused and engaged in music-making and music exploration.
- Collaborate effectively and respectfully in the preparation and support of students in both curricular and co-curricular pursuits.
- Perform as a professional associate artist for student and school performances across a range of music styles.
- Be competent in the use of educational, music and administrative software programs.
- Collaboratively plan, prepare, and execute performances showcasing individual students and ensembles.
- Teach Specialist Individual Violin Lessons acknowledging School's status as an IB PYP, MYP, DP and CP school, and expand one's knowledge and understanding of the IB Programmes in The Arts.
- Demonstrate high levels of effective and respectful collaborative skills to contribute to the faculty goals and directions.
- Maintain a professional awareness of the educational, social, and emotional needs of students.
- Actively support student engagement in service-learning program(s) of the school, both within instrumental lessons, ensemble performances and beyond it.
- Attend all identified assemblies and Professional Learning days if required.
- Actively support and demonstrate proficiency in the use of the School's Learning Management System and associated programmes (e.g., Microsoft Teams/OneNote, TASS, Toddle)
- Any other duties as directed by the Principal or their delegate.

- The capacity to be effective in a fast-paced musical environment.
- The ability to navigate successfully and efficiently across a large whole school campus.
- The capacity to collect and return Junior School students to and from their classroom for their scheduled lesson time.
- A demonstrated clarity of moral purpose, vision, and commitment to learning.
- Possess relevant IT skills and be competent in the use of the Microsoft Office suite of applications.
- A demonstrated clarity of educational purpose, vision, and engagement with our School Values.
- Applicants should be prepared to contribute to the school's co-curricular program in area(s) of interest or expertise.
